We were excited to welcome Pastor Shive to St. John's in early November. Call Committee members had a chance to sit down with him to converse and he learned more about all we are doing at St. John's. Sadly, he declined the call, sharing that he would like to continue his work at his current church and that he feels it is in the best interest of his family to stay at their current location.

We then called on Pastor Stein from Beecher, IL who, when we initially called him to ask for an interview, shared that he was contemplating another call. He ended up accepting that call.

The committee will get together again in the coming weeks to re-evaluate what we've done thus far, review the church needs and goals, and determine next steps. We have excellent guest pastors sharing the Word of God with us each week and each have said they enjoy being here and will continue supporting us during this time. We are truly blessed in this time of transition.



PARSONAGE UPDATE

The parsonage project is taking shape and beautiful improvements are being made. Most noticeable when you first walk in are the beautiful custom cabinets in the freshly painted kitchen. New lighting has been installed, and we are nearly ready to install the sink faucet and appliances.

If you can help lift appliances into the kitchen, please contact Marv Baty. Help would be very welcomed.

Throughout the main level (kitchen, dining and living room) the new flooring and base boards are nearly complete and greatly improved the overall space. Six-panel doors have been installed throughout the main level and are beautiful!

A very welcoming archway from the front door into the house (which used to be two doors, as it was an apartment) has been completed along with the banister going up the stairs. The cross on the banister is a nice touch, too.

Thank you to all who have put so many hours into improving the parsonage for the next pastor. Thank you to those who have blessed this project by donating materials and money to make these improvements happen. Your generosity is not unnoticed.

There is still much to be done, and as discussed at that last Voters' Meeting the trustees are still in need of \$15,000 to complete this project. Please consider donating to this project to help us get it completed. Giving envelopes are still available in the fellowship hall.

WHAT'S NEXT? While there are things that still need to be completed on the current projects, the next big project is repairing/painting the back entry/laundry room space. Additionally, more support needs to be added to the basement to reinforce the new kitchen space.

Finally, we are moving to the upper level. Windows are being repaired, and we are adding some closet space and lighting. The original wood floors throughout will be sanded and stained.

Again, thank you to our wonderful volunteers who make this project happen. St. John's is truly blessed to have such a great team of talented volunteers!

WHY AM I ASSIGNED TO A SERVICE GROUP? WHAT IS IT?

What does a service group do and why is my name listed in one (or why isn't it)? A church needs help from its members to run smoothly. As events come up, such as funerals, weekly fellowship or special events (Group 3), we are in need of people to help serve. All able members are assigned to a service group (Group 1 through Group 4). Groups are rotated to serve during these different events. The group chairperson will contact names from their group if they need help. For example, if there is a funeral you may be contacted to bring a dessert, set-up/clean-up, or serve. During Sunday fellowship, the group number responsible for that month is listed and we ask you sign up if you are able to serve a Sunday.
